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SCOPE AND PURPOSE

The Editors and Editorial Board invite original research reports on pharmacokinetic, bioavailability, and drug interaction studies, clinical trials, investigations of specific pharmacological properties of drugs, and related topics.

Original reports are published in one of the following departments:

- **Original Research Articles.** These are full-length original research articles, representing substantial, novel research in areas such as therapeutics, pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, and pharmacoeconomics. Word and reference limits: Text: 3,500 words, excluding abstract, references, tables, and figures; Abstract: 300 words; References: 75 maximum.
